Rent Reminder



Rent is due every month by the **5th**. You will need to make sure it is brought to the office, or post marked no later than the 5th to avoid a late fee of **\$35.00**. If a late fee is applied you will have 30 days from the date it is charged to your account to pay in full. KHA will mail a monthly statement which will reflect the \$35.00 charge. All NSF checks returned for insufficient funds also will reflect a \$35 fee added to your account and a coordinator will contact you. If you have a NSF at any time during your residency, we will no longer take personal checks and you must pay in a cashier's check or money order. [CFR 24 966.4 (b)(4)]

***Please note that KHA does not accept partial payments. Rent must be paid in full and will inquire a late fee if received after the 5th of the month. ***

Scheduled Meetings with Coordinators

We want to remind all KHA tenants that meetings/reexamination interviews are a requirement and cannot be missed. A notification letter will be sent by first-class mail and will contain the date, time, and location of the meeting. In addition, the letter will inform the family of the information and documentation that must be brought to the meeting/interview. If the family is unable to attend, the family should contact KHA in advance of the scheduled date and time to request a new appointment. In all circumstances, if a family does not attend the scheduled meeting/interview, KHA will send a second notices with a new date and time. If a family fails to attend two scheduled meetings/interviews without KHA approval, the family will be in violation of their lease and may be terminated in accordance with the Admissions and Continued Occupancy Policy for Public Housing.

Welcome Mary to the KHA Family

KHA wants to welcome Mary as the new Family Self-Sufficiency (FSS)/Resident Opportunities and Self-Sufficiency (ROSS) coordinator. Both of these programs are to assist families that live in Public Housing with needs to be more self-sufficient.

Family Self Sufficiency (FSS) is a program that encourages families that participate in either the Public Housing, or Housing Choice Voucher (HCV/S) programs to take control of their dreams for the future and achieve personal and financial goals. When you sign up for FSS, the benefits you can expect are:

- One on One coaching with coordinator;
- Referrals to local services in your area;
- A Savings account that will grow as your earned income increases

Resident Opportunities and Self-Sufficiency (ROSS) is a program that provides critical link between program participants, local resources that can assist them, and PHA and property staff. Some of the ways this program assists are:

- Enhance quality of life by connecting residents to services and activities;
- Enable participants live in independently;
- Avoid more costly forms of care, such as nursing homes or other institutional facilities.

Frequently Asked Questions



KHA gets a lot of the same questions from clients, so we wanted to go over a few that are popular.

1. **Question:** Can I paint the interior of my unit?
Answer: You will need maintenance's permission and it can only be the same color the unit is already painted.
2. **Question:** If I receive charges (i.e. Maintenance, Late fee), when must I pay them by?
Answer: You will need to pay any charges that occur on your account within 30 days of receiving a letter from KHA about the charges.
3. **Question:** Can KHA waive my late fee if I'm late on my rent?
Answer: If we waive a late fee for one client, we will have to waive them for all clients. To make sure we are following Fair Housing, KHA does not waive late fees.
4. **Question:** Is it okay for me to smoke on my front/back porch?
Answer: No, you must be twenty (25) feet away from **all** KHA properties.
